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## Cast Bios

Scrooge. This is Bill's fourth performance with NSP, having played the role of Daryl Grady in the 2018 production of "Curtains", William Henry Blore in "And Then There Were None" (2017) and Ernie and (Voice of) Sam Wainwright in "It's a Wonderful Life" (2015). Bill has also been in two productions with the Pentucket Players, namely Babcock in "Mame" (2017), and Simeon and Potiphar in "Joseph" (2016). His initial venture into acting was back in 2006 with



the Burlington Players production of "Wait Until Dark", where he had a bit part as officer #1 (not #2) and worked backstage. 
life. Although it's disappointing not to be in a theater with a live audience, this is a great way to relive the radio theater of the 1930s and 40s."
