

A Note from the Youth Coordinator

Like many people my age, I grew up with the cartoon strip, Peanuts. The humor coming from observing ordinary things is what I liked the most. It always made me laugh. Especially how many times Charlie Brown tries to kick that football only to have it pulled away at the last moment. As Youth Coordinator for North Shore Players, I was aware that children today have not necessarily been exposed to the comic strip on a daily basis, as I was. However, I was certain that the characters and short humorous observations in the life of the Peanuts Gang was relatable to both the youth participating on stage this weekend, and adults of any generation in the audience. We can all relate to one of the characters in the show. There are so many things in it to hold our attention. The music is terrific. The characters are distinct and hilarious. The tone is both loving and honest about the ups and downs of being a kid. This play being so iconic needed to remain true to the original nature of Charlie Brown- the Blockhead that everyone knows and loves as well as a set design that was cartoonish and fun for the actors to perform on.
